

# Download Fifty Bicycles That Changed The World

## Design Museum Fifty

Museum bicycles from 1875 to 1944 on display at Classic Cycle, a bike shop and museum on Bainbridge Island, located near Seattle. A bicycle, also called a cycle or bike, is a human-powered or motor-powered, pedal-driven, single-track vehicle, having two wheels attached to a frame, one behind the other. A bicycle rider is called a cyclist, or bicyclist. Bicycles were introduced in the late 19th century in Europe, and by the early 21st century, more than 1 billion were in existence at a given time. Museum bicycles from 1986 to 2000 on display at Classic Cycle, a bike shop on Bainbridge Island, located near Seattle and Tacoma. The designer of the padded ATB airdrop bag, SF MSG Lee Cashwell (Retired) acted as the primary jumpmaster employing U.S. military jump procedures for the C-212. Grenadier/scout LT Jeffrey Schram and Combat Medical Specialist, SF 18D SSG Ernest Hoppe followed their non-folding AT bikes and ATAC on a palletized bundle (Kudos Rigger SGT Ken Potter) on the first pass to demonstrate this technique.
