

Download Sheep And Goats Children Lesson

Show the pictures The Last Judgment and The Second Coming at appropriate times as you teach the children the parable of the sheep and the goats from Matthew 25:31–46. (For suggested ways to teach the scripture account, see “Teaching from the Scriptures,” p. vii.) Discussion and Application Questions To Remember: we will be judged on the sincerity of our behavior Vocabulary. judgment: When Jesus separates those going to heaven and those going to hell Lesson Matthew 25:31–46 Jesus uses the picture of a shepherd separating his sheep from his goats to explain what judgment will be like. (Sheep and Goats Lesson 2) The ability to read from multiple perspectives is also a valuable tool for reading the Bible and one I have tried to encourage in a number of Stories on the Way lessons. The second lesson on the parable of the sheep and goats, invites students to think of themselves as those in need rather than as those who help. Here we go. (Hold up the picture sheet provided with this lesson and let the children see if they can tell the sheep from the goats. Print the answer page on the back side so that you can see it.) Wow!
