Oedipus Rex

Oedipus Rex, also known by its Greek title, Oedipus Tyrannus (Ancient Greek: οἰδίπους τύραννος IPA: [oidípʊs týranˈos]), or Oedipus the King, is an Athenian tragedy by Sophocles that was first performed around 429 BC. Originally, to the ancient Greeks, the title was simply Oedipus (οἰδίπους), as it is referred to by Aristotle in the Poetics. Antigone (/ æ n ˈ t ɪ ˈ n i / ann-TIG-nee; Ancient Greek: ἀντιγόνη) is a tragedy by Sophocles written in or before 441 BC.. Of the three Theban plays Antigone is the third in order of the events depicted in the plays, but it is the first that was written.
